
The past three years have not been normal

- Early 2018 exports to China surged in anticipation of the impending trade war with China
- Late 2018 through 2019 exports fell as the trade war intensified
- 2020 Covid shutdown... no, wait
- Late 2020, early 2021 prices swelled as supply could not keep up with demand




Consumption of Hardwood Lumber by Major U.S. Markets




Hardwood Lumber Price Indexes




One-Year Change in Kiln-Dried Price Index: +68.90%

One-Year Change in Green Price Index: +82.07%






All SYP KD Lumber Volume Weighted MBF Lumber Price 2017 - YTD 2021













U.S. Hardwood Lumber Exports to China and the Rest of the World






- In 2018 and 2019 the U.S. economy was experiencing the longest economic expansion (10 years+) in history.
- 20 years of market development in China had resulted in a true U.S. export success story.
 - Chinese customers were buying higher quality and a wider variety of grades
 - Much of the lumber imported was staying in China
- But unfortunately, the hardwood lumber industry became a casualty in a trade war that wasn't even about wood trade.
- The industry was reeling from the trade war...and then Covid hit.




Demand is strong; supply is constrained

- The past three years have been extremely challenging for the hardwood industry and have eroded supply capability.
- Sawmills need markets for both appearance and utility grades, but most of the margin is in appearance grades, and the loss of China business was almost all appearance grades.
 - According to HMR Executive, an 8.5% drop in sawmill production could amount to more than a 45% drop in revenue.
- We lost some capacity, and what capacity remained is underutilized due to problems created by Covid.

The supply chain got messed up


- Labor shortages
 - Labor has been hesitant to return
 sawmills and loggers
- Severe shortage of truckers for logs and finished goods
- Container shortages and skyrocketing freight rates
- JIT inventories depleted
- Hardwood mills cutting softwood

June Year-to-Date




Recovery from trauma takes time

- The trade war with China followed by the Covid pandemic were severe blows to the wood products industry.
- That the pandemic would lead to a boom in repair & remodel and more housing starts was unforeseen.
- Supply chains are adjusting, but it will take some time.
- Hardwood lumber prices are expected to pull back some over time but will most likely stay at elevated levels though this year.
- Fortunately, the economic outlook is good.




WASHINGTON STATE MONTHLY ALDER EXPORTS






U.S. MONTHLY HARDWOOD LUMBER EXPORTS






Washington State Alder Lumber Exports

June YTD 2021




Washington State Alder Lumber Exports to Vietnam
