



"Eastern US hardwood sawmill production was trekking at 5.65 billion board feet (BBF) at the midpoint of 2023.


This compares to 7.38 BBF at the midpoint of last year.

The difference is a drop of 1.73 BBF or minus 23.4%."




US Lumber Exports (Board Feet)






Jan-June YOY Volume Change in 2023

Alder Exports (m3)





Jan Mar May July Sept Nov Jan Mar May July S


Blue – Before Tariffs. Yellow – Initial Tariffs Red- Full Tariffs Green – Tariffs Removed

Dark Green Lockdowns Removed



Peak China?

- Consumer spending down even after lockdowns lifted
- Manufacturing contracted for 4th straight month in July
- Exports down 14.5%, imports down 12.4% through July
- Youth unemployment 21%, shrinking population
- Housing prices continue to decline, home sales down 33%
- De-Risking/De-Coupling?






Oxford Economics estimated at the end of 2022 that Chinese housing demand was 8 million units per year from 2010 through 2019 but would drop to only 4.6 million per year from next year through 2030.

People have moved to the cities, birth rates are falling, and housing speculation has cooled

US Hardwood Lumber and Logs to China (m3)




Logs and Lumber to China

- Easier to hold lumber inventory logs must be used faster
- Chinese companies prefer to saw their dimensions/grade
- Chinese High-End market prefers US-sawn lumber, but that market segment has slowed down – consumers more price conscious

Current Trends in China

- Small bounce in spring, timing price of market
- Starting to pick back up over last two weeks
- Show seasonal buying
- US Sawmills willing to keep supply low at current price






Lumber to India (Board Feet)

Red Oak Lumber Exports







European Union Deforestation-Free Regulation (EUDR)



EUDR Timeline







	EUTR (Current)	EUDR (New Law)
Products	Timber	Timber, cattle, cocoa, coffee, oil palm, rubber, soya
Prohibitions	Illegally Harvested	Illegally harvested, contrary to social law, deforested, degraded
Traceability	To Country of harvest, beyond that to the extent necessary to demonstrate negligible risk	Geolocation of "plot of land(s)" where harvesting took place with each consignment irrespective of risk

Definitions of deforestation & forest degradation

"Deforestation-free" means:

- (a) that the products are sourced from land that has not been subject to deforestation after 31 December 2020, and
- (b) specifically for timber products, that the timber was harvested from the forest without inducing forest degradation after 31 December 2020.

"Deforestation" means (from FAO):

conversion of forest to agricultural use, whether human induced or not.

"Forest" means:

land that exceeds 0.5 hectares with trees higher than 5 metres and a canopy cover that exceeds 10%.

"Forest degradation" means (no internationally agreed definition):

structural changes to the forest cover, taking the form of a conversion of primary forests or naturally regenerated forests into plantation forests or other wooded lands.

"Primary forest" means


naturally regenerated forest of native tree species, without any human activities or ecological disturbances.

"Naturally regenerated forest" means

forest predominantly composed of trees established through natural regeneration including (examples given....)

What Does this Mean for the US?

- US widely expected to be classified as "low risk," but not guaranteed
- Geolocation requirement applies regardless of risk level
- Geolocation will limit direct exports to EU and sales to manufacturers in third countries (China, SE Asia, Turkey, UK) selling into EU
- Will incentivize purchasing from large companies with timber land
- Exporters will have to provide hundreds of geolocations with their exports, and if one site is deforested/degraded, the consignment will be confiscated and the exporter prosecuted



AHEC Response to EUDR

- Outreach to European Industry
 - Target EUDR Regulators in largest markets
 - Work with trade associations (CEI-Bois, ETTF, etc) to pressure representatives
- Outreach to Environmental Journalists
- Study to assess:
 - Impact/cost to average hardwood producer
 - Technology solutions (like onX mapping)
 - Potential legal action with WTO
- Update American Hardwood Environmental Profile (AHEP)
